#### Lemelson Center Fellowship Program, 2025-2026

The Lemelson Center Fellowship Program supports projects that present creative approaches to the study of invention and innovation in American society. These include, but are not limited to, historical research and documentation projects resulting in dissertations, publications, exhibitions, educational initiatives, documentary films, or other multimedia products. The Center annually awards two to three fellowships to pre-doctoral graduate students, post-doctoral scholars, and other professionals (e.g. authors, journalists, attorneys) who have completed some advanced training (e.g. usually an MA or JD, but please inquire if you have questions).

#### PhD Fellowship in Environmental History, University of Stavanger

The University of Stavanger invites applicants for a PhD Fellowship in Environmental History at the Faculty of Arts and Education, Department of Cultural Studies and Languages. The position is vacant from 1 November 2024 (with a negotiable start date). This is a trainee position that will give promising researchers an opportunity for academic development through a PhD education leading to a doctoral degree. The hired candidate will be admitted to the PhD program in Educational Sciences and Humanities. The appointment is for three years with research duties exclusively, or four years with both research and other career-promoting work. Research topic: a PhD position in environmental history to research relations between humans, environments, and energy in an independently developed project. The project must be positioned at the intersection of environmental and energy history.

#### 2 PhD Positions, Division of Science, Technology and Society, Chalmers University of Technology

1. PhD position in Energy and Environmental History: The PhD candidate will work in a cross-disciplinary setting to consider the possible future role of hydrogen in the Swedish energy system from a historical perspective. The position is funded by the Swedish Energy Agency through the programme Research School Energy Systems and within the framework of the position you participate in the Research School Energy Systems' activities (read more at <a href="foes.se">foes.se</a>). The project also aligns with the division's new research program on infrastructures in the modern and contemporary world. The research will take place in close collaboration with a PhD student and supervision team with engineering backgrounds at Linköping University, including co-writing articles and participating in common supervision meetings and workshops. Applicants are invited to propose their own research project within this framework focusing on hydrogen. Possible topics to be studied could include: historical infrastructure development and use, historical attempts to introduce new energy technologies into an existing system, visions and expectations of a future energy system, user acceptance and resistance

to new energy technology, social, spacial, sustainability and justice aspects of new energy technology introduction. Applicants are encouraged to discuss their choice topics with Anna Åberg, the project's main supervisor.

2. PhD position in History of Technology: The PhD project will be part of the Division's new research program on infrastructures in the modern and contemporary world. Infrastructure is broadly understood as the material and immaterial systems needed to operate a society or enterprise. Applicants are invited to propose their own research project within this openly defined program. Possible topics include: historical case studies of transport, urban or digital infrastructures, critical infrastructures, dismantling of infrastructures, infrastructural transitions, maintenance of infrastructures, or political economy of infrastructures. Applicants are encouraged to discuss the choice topics with Professor Per Lundin, the project's main supervisor.

#### Postdoctoral position in the history of energy infrastructures, Chalmers University of Technology

The Division of Science, Technology and Society (STS) at Chalmers University of Technology is seeking a postdoctoral scholar in energy history to research relations between humans, infrastructures, and energy in an independently developed project. The project is positioned at the intersection of history of technology and energy history. The person employed will be working closely with an international research project funded NORDFORSK that aims to analyse how people and communities have lived with, through and shaped energy transitions throughout history. Applicants are invited to propose their own research project within this framework focusing on large energy infrastructures, such as oil refineries, district heating, energy buildings and infrastructure afterlives. The Postdoctoral project will benefit from synergies with the division's new research program on infrastructures in the modern and contemporary world. Deadline for applications: October 18th, 2024.

#### PhD Fellowship "Energy Lives! Infrastructural Citizenship in Nordic Energy Transitions", Aarhus University

Applications are invited for a PhD fellowship/scholarship at Graduate School of Natural Sciences, Aarhus University, Denmark, within the mathematics programme (science studies programme). The position is available from February 2025 or later. Research area and project description (Title: Energy Lives! Infrastructural Citizenship in Nordic Energy Transitions, Subproject: Citizens for District Heating in Denmark): The project Energy Lives! scrutinizes the conjoined lives of energy and people in the Nordic countries. It seeks to understand how publics and communities emerge around ways of living with and through energy transitions and how such publics shape and constrain energy transitions over long time periods. The project applies the concept of infrastructural citizenship to uncover mechanisms of agency, appropriation, and resistance in energy transitions, distributed among people, politics, and infrastructures. Deadline for applications: November 1st, 2024.
